








Area of Programing





Target Population

Pregnant women, neonates, infants, and young children, focusing on the critical (-9 to +24 months) or the 'first 1000 days of life'

Care Group Model







Health Action

- Maternal and Child health
- Promoting health seeking behavior of reproductive women, especially pregnant and postnatal women on Antenatal Care (ANC) and Post Natal Care (PNC) and healthy practicing.
- Promoting child vaccinated.
- Promoting on Communicable disease prevention whereas Malaria, Dengue Fever

Nutrition Action

 Promote mother and child nutrition for the first 1000 days of life throughout BF awareness, complementary feeding, cooking demonstration



WASH Action

- Promoting essential practice on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) in community
- Promoting WASH in School (WinS) throughout sanitation constructed and hygiene practice
- Promoting WASH in Health Care Facility such as waste management, sanitation construction and hygiene.
- Support Covid-19 prevention

Achievement in the last six months

Health achievement

- 9 HC staff supported to ANC/PNC and C-IMC refresher course
- 29 VHSGs trained on ANC/PNC and C-IMC
- 495 community people received and participated in health training on how to have good health, prevent disease, good nutrition and caring for their children.







IN A MARKING MALL

Nutrition Achievement

- 9 HC staff supported to BFCI refresher course
- 29 VHSGs trained on BFCI and nutritious porridge making
- 220 community people received and participated in good nutrition and caring for their children.
- 307 children under 5 years old joined in growth monitoring

WASH Achievement:



- 176 (24 women) formed WASH member from CCWC, Village leader (VL), VHSGs, youth and church leaders and 46 people got trained on water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) essential needs
- * 1421 people throughout village cleaning, awareness and training.
- Supported 292 water tanks to poor 1 & 2 households for water storage facilities and

created taps for hand washing facilities

- 12 set of hygiene kits provided to 12 model HH
- 217 households created owned tippy taps for hand washing

WASH Achievement:



- 114 villages were selected to implement the CLTS approach.
- * 217 (195 women) were capacity building on hygiene promotion, hand washing and environmental cleaning.
- * 12,298 benefits from hygiene promotion, and safe drinking water.
- Supported 38 community members to lead sanitation and hygiene reflection meetings and updated the communities'-built latrines and planning




WASH IN SCHOOL

- Trained 57 school directors and teachers on Minimum Requirement guidelines on WASH In School (3 stars approach)
- 8 primary school latrines renovation and group hand washing installations, benefiting 1,128 (528 girls) school children.
- 2 New inclusive latrine construction in schools
- Worked with the school director and SBMC to promote basic hygiene awareness raising, body hygiene and MHM to 778 (240 girls) students.
- Supported 149 segregated trash bins in 86 primary schools and 45 community pre-schools.









- Well cooperative with local authority, government partners.
- Community williness to participate and learning from program.
- Well cooperative with local NGOs, INGOs and UN agencies.

Challenges

• Community people migrants crossing the border to Thailand for jobs and seasonal migration so unexpected participants lower the plans.

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 Limited WASH infrastructure and leadership in community and School Leadership
